Markleeville's Annual Teddy Bear Parade is happening THIS MONTH!


This event is open and free to all Alpine County children & families!




The Alpine County Archives is proud to announce that we have been awarded a Groundworks Grant in order to facilitate disaster preparedness in our Archives and Library branch facilities. With this funding, we will develop a comprehensive disaster plan, equip our buildings with kits to adequately respond to flooding, and acquire protective and adaptable storage for our collection of historic maps. We are grateful to have this opportunity to further our mission of conserving and protecting Alpine County's history in light of the natural hazards we face.
