



SNOWMOBILE RIDING RULES IN BEAR VALLEY VILLAGE:

- Speed limit is 15 MPH in all areas
- After digging out your snowmobile, be courteous and fill in the hole or be subject to a hazard fine
- Large groups must break up into a single line on the far-right side of the road
- Snowmobiles are powerful machines. Do not let children and young teens ride alone.
- Minimize recreational riding in the Bear Valley Village by using approved trails to access USFS lands.
- Do not ride on private property or common areas without permission
- Slow for and yield to pedestrians and skiers and snowboarders
- Pedestrians and skiers should use the middle of the lane and snowmobilers should use the far-right side
- Tune your machine, avoid idling, and use synthetic oil to reduce emissions
- All machines must have a muffler to meet the maximum residential sound limit of 65db
- Except for travel to business or residences, riding between 10PM and 6AM is prohibited
- Do not operate an oversnow vehicle while intoxicated. You can be subject to a DUI.



SNOWMOBILE PARKING RULES IN BEAR VALLEY VILLAGE:

- Short term parking is up to 6 days with a move day every week for grooming. Long term parking is more than 1 week with no move days for grooming
- No parking on groomed roadways. Park in your driveway or designated areas for short- and long-term parking
- Snow machines parked in No Parking zones will be cited and towed
- Loading/Unloading Zones are not for parking but for active loading/unloading only. Do not load/unload in the Emergency Vehicle Access Lanes
- Grooming occurs on move days (Tuesday mornings on the Quaking Aspen side and Friday Mornings on the NoName Road side). Snowmobiles must be moved 5AM to 7AM on these days
- After moving your vehicle, refill the hazardous hole to avoid injury and a citation
