

### NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

1. APPLICANT: Alpine County Community Development
2. ADDRESS: 50 Diamond Valley Road
3. PHONE NUMBER: 530 694 2140
4. LEAD AGENCY: Alpine County, California
5. PROJECT TITLE: Hot Springs Road Erosion Control and Repair
6. DESCRIPTION: Repair and stabilize a down slope shoulder of Hot Springs Road that was washed out in the February 2017 winter storms. Fill material and rock rip rap will be placed on the slope to hold in place. Road shoulder repair and minor drainage correction work will also be done. The project is located on Hot Springs Road approximately 1.5 miles west of Markleeville.

**ADMINISTRATIVE DETERMINATION:** The Planning Department has completed a preliminary review of this project in accordance with Alpine County adopted guidelines for implementing the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) of 1970. Based on that review, the Environmental Administrator finds that the proposed project constitutes a Categorical Exemption. Therefore, the Environmental Administrator has determined that further environmental evaluation is not required because:

[ X] The project is classified as an Emergency Project pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15269: Projects to maintain, repair, restore, demolish, or replace property or facilities damaged or destroyed as a result of a disaster in a disaster stricken area in which a state of emergency has been proclaimed by the Governor pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act, commencing with Section 8550 of the Government Code.
